Rationale for Amendment:
Much conversation has occurred about the relationship between the Texas Speech Communication Association and the Texas Forensic Association and the value-added nature of most high school educators to be TSCA members has been questioned. In addition, insurance from the National Federation can be attained either directly from the National Federation for High Schools or from the National Speech and Debate Association. While it should be noted that membership in the TSCA and/or the NFHS might be in the best interest of members, a <u>requirement</u> that one joins both organizations seems paternalistic. One consequence of a choice might also be for the leadership of TSCA to work year in and year out to push the interest of Texas Forensic Association members at all levels throughout the year.
